Lorraine



Lorraine went to a number of Falkirk FC matches and appreciated the ability to attend the matches alongside their child who they provide care to, as well as various members of their family, allowing for a unique experience at every match.

Lorraine initially worried that their child would not enjoy the match and may struggle to sit for the duration; however, they loved it! Lorraine said, "I wouldn't have tried in the first place as I thought he wouldn't sit and doesn't enjoy watching it on the tv however I was so surprised that he loved it!".

Lorraine explained that through the generosity of the tickets, they have a new superfan in the home as her son now owns all the strips and jackets and even enjoyed a trip to the pub within the Stadium and he won the competition twice.

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Lorraine also attended the semi-final match at Hampden which was a brand-new experience, and their child was **immersed in the atmosphere**, from the train journey to the camaraderie at the match itself.

It was found that even the walking to the matches themselves was a great benefit to their child who can be a bit reluctant to participate at other times, but they always enjoyed it and experienced the benefits of the fresh air and exercise.

These tickets have created unique memories for Lorraine and their family.











Robert

As Falkirk fans, this was an exhilarating experience.

Robert was identified as a carer after seeing a social media promotion regarding the donation of home match tickets from the Falkirk Community Foundation. After a discussion with an adult carer support worker, Robert and their spouse were supported to register and explore other supports available such as an Adult Carer Support Plan.

Robert and their spouse are caring for their child with various health conditions. Robert's spouse was supported to access tickets to attend a match alongside their younger children who loved the experience. As Falkirk fans, this was an exhilarating experience for the children who made new memories on the day, such as meeting the Club mascot.

Robert explained that these were seen as adventures by the children and the outings to the football have been helpful to the whole family. The ability to get the children out doing something that they enjoy and being part of the community spirit has been valuable to Robert. Robert explained that they are a family of six and the generous donations assured that they could still see their Club without the financial pressures currently faced due to the cost-of-living crisis.

a lot of our days out focus around our daughter - or don't happen because she can't manage them that day - so do have something just for the boys to look forward too was very nice."
